Dallas, Tex. Dec. 2 (AP) - Former Maj. Gen. Edwin A. Walker said today the assassination of President Kennedy "had very, very serious implications, worldwide."

"God has given a warning which no man alive can ignore," Walker told a news conference. "The doors of our country are wide open to foreign penetration."

He described accused assassin Lee Harvey Oswald as a "national traveler, world traveler, and fellow traveler," and said the "tragic assassination" could have happened in any city.

He cited "malicious attacks" by Pravda, The Worker, and Fidel Castro on the conservative right wing of U.S. politics, and said the citizens of Dallas have the responsibility to ensure that the truth is brought out.

Osterstock said he became concerned about the safety of hotel guests, including Walker.
