# Ordeal by Applause

Somewhere during his speech at the University of California yesterday, it must have occurred to former Major General Edwin A. Walker that his audience was infiltrated with hard-core ironists.

The applause, to his apparent irritation, invariably came at the wrong places.

"We," the general boomed, "have had 30 years of the same international policy without any change!"

"The United Nations," he declared derisively "de-

mands that the whole world integrate."

"We're looking not for a military coup or takeover in this country," he boomed. "Maybe what you are seeing is a takeover of the military."

Deafening cheers.

More than 1000 persons — presumably students — attended the general's seminar in the Pauley Ballroom of the UC Student Union. It was sponsored by the Honor Students Society.

Cheers and hurrahs greeted Walker when he presented a map of the world upside-down and blamed the topsyturviness on the United Nations.

But there were some sour notes.

"The black race — most of whom are fine people — will find more unhappiness under integration than under the present system," Walker informed a dead-silent audience.

"Independence," he said, "will have to be accomplished by segregation."

The cheering had stopped.
