## Another Gun

Using the name "L. H. Oswald," a New Jersey newspaper has bought a 38-caliber pistol from an Oklahoma mail order house on the eve of the second anniversary of the assassination of President Kennedy.

In a copyright article yesterday, the Morning Call of Paterson announced the purchase of the lethal weapon similar to the one it was established Lee Harvey Oswald used to kill Dallas policeman J. D. Tippit, shortly after President Kennedy was shot down.

The gun, which arrived via Railway Express, was turned over to the State Attorney General, Authur J. Sills.

Under present New Jersey gun laws a person must have a police permit to purchase or carry a pistol, although ri-fles and shotguns do not require registration.

Sills said the ease with which the gun was purchased was "a strong endorsement for enactment of Federal legislation so that guns could not be shipped by mail order houses to individuals they have not checked on."
