CHICAGO, SEPT. 12 (AP)-A POKE AT THE U. S. SUPREME COURT BY SEN. BARRY GOLDWATER, THREE PROFESSORS' COUNTERATTACKS AND PSYCHOLOGICAL ANALYSIS OF THE "TYPICAL" RIGHT WINGER HIGHLIGHTED YESTERDAY'S SESSION OF THE AMERICAN POLITICAL SCIENCE ASSOCIATION CONVENTION.

THE REPUBLICAN PRESIDENTIAL NOMINEE ACCUSED THE SUPREME COURT OF USING "RAW AND NAKED POWER" TO IMPOSE ITS DECISIONS UPON THE AMERICAN PEOPLE.

THE COMMENT DREW SCATTERED APPLAUSE AMONG THE 1,500 PROFESSIONAL POLITICAL SCIENTISTS IN ATTENDANCE. MOST OF THEM LISTENED IN SILENCE.

AFTER GOLDWATER'S SPEECH, THREE OF HIS LISTENERS CALLED A PRESS CONFERENCE TO DEFEND THE SUPREME COURT.

C. HERMAN PRITCHETT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO, OUTGOING APSA PRESIDENT, RETORTED: "ANYTHING GOLDWATER REGARDS AS UNDESIRABLE IS NOT NECESSARILY UNCONSTITUTIONAL."

"GOLDWATER FEELS THERE SHOULD BE A STANDARD INTERPRETATION," SAID ANOTHER PROFESSOR, DAVID J. DANIELSKI OF YALE. "HE DOESN'T KNOW WHAT THE FRAMERS (OF THE CONSTITUTION) INTENDED ANYMORE THAN WE DO."

DAVID FELLMAN OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SAID THE SUPREME COURT DOESN'T INVITE LITIGATION BUT "HAS TO DECIDE CASES BROUGHT BEFORE IT."

EARLIER IN THE DAY, A TEXAS POLITICAL SCIENTIST DESCRIBED THE TYPICAL MEMBER OF THE RADICAL RIGHT IN THE SOUTHWEST AS A WEALTHY STATUS SEEKER IN A HOSTILE SOCIAL CLIMATE.

"THE PRIMARY HOSTILITY OF THE RADICAL RIGHT IS DIRECTED NOT AT COMMUNISTS OR EVEN LIBERALS," SAID MURRAY CLARK HAVENS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS, "BUT AT THE POSSESSORS OF STATUS AND THE WIELDERS OF SOCIAL, ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL POWER, REGARDLESS OF REAL IDEOLOGICAL POSITIONS OF THESE MEMBERS OF THE ESTABLISHMENT."

THE TYPICAL RIGHT WINGER HAS BEEN BROUGHT UP TO BELIEVE THAT MONEY IS THE KEY TO POLITICAL POWER, HAVENS SAID, AND HE BECOMES FRUSTRATED WHEN HE IS RELATIVELY WEALTHY AND STILL CANNOT ENTER THE ESTABLISHMENT.
