

Retired Officer Accused Of Threat to Kill Johnson

DAYTON, Ohio, June 16 (UPI)

—A retired Air Force captain was arrested at Wright-Patterson Air Force base Wednesday and charged with having threatened to kill President Johnson.

Secret Service agents reported that Dorsey Lee Webster Jr., 54 years old, of Richmond, had telephoned the White House at about 10 o'clock Tuesday night. The call was taken by a staff Secret Service agent, Clark Fisher. Mr. Fisher reported the retired officer had said, "I'm going to kill Johnson—I'm going to kill that. . . ."

The agents said they had charged him with only one offense, although he had made many other threats on the President's life, apparently over a period of at least three months.

The agents said Webster had rented a room at the air base's bachelor officer quarters on arrival here Monday night.
