DALLAS, Sept. 21 — The Texas School Book Depository, where Lee Harvey Oswald fired the shots that killed President Kennedy, is up for sale for \$1-million.

The building on the west edge of downtown is still an attraction for visitors.

In 1970, Aubrey Mayhew, a Nashville promoter, bought the depository at auction for \$650,000, and said he intended to put his collection of Kennedy memorabilia there. In 1972, the Republic National Bank of Dallas foreclosed, and ownership reverted to a Dallas oilman, D. Harold Byrd.

Mr. Byrd's firm has begun advertising the 80,000-square-foot building for sale. Last week, the Dallas County commissioners heard a report on the feasibility of buying the building for use in storing voting machines.
