# Gregory Says Data Links CIA to Kennedy Slaying

Washington

Comedian-political activist Dick Gregory met yesterday with CIA probe aides to present evidence that he said links the CIA to the assassination of former President Kennedy.

Gregory, meeting with investigators from Vice President Nelson Rockefeller's commission, brought with him the only known film of the Kennedy assassination, taken by amateur photographer Abraham Zapruder.

Gregory said he had evidence the CIA planned the

assassination (Gregory said he was getting ready to break up the CIA when he was killed," Gregory said at a news conference shortly before he and his associates met with commission investigators.

In other action, House Democrats agreed yesterday to create another special committee to investigate the CIA and other U.S. intelligence agencies.

The 24-member Democratic Steering and Policy Committee voted unanimously to create the select House committee similar to one named

improperly on Americans.

The panel also will investigate the need for overt and covert intelligence agencies at home and abroad.

Speaker Carl Albert said the new House committee must make its report by Jan. 31, 1976.

The steering committee bypassed the caucus of all House Democrats and sent the measure directly to the House floor, where a vote is expected early next week.
