Special to The New York Times WASHINGTON, July 9-The Justice Department, carrying out a threat it made last month, began today a legal push to require recalcitrant Southern school districts to desegregate by September.

Attorney General John N. Mitchell announced that the department had sued the state of Mississippi and a number of individual school systems in Arkansas, Florida and South Carolina.

In all, the Justice Department haled into court today 46 of the estimated 100 Deep South the estimated 100 Deep South school districts that had failed to produce acceptable desegregation plans and were not yet under the jurisdiction of the Federal courts. A department spokesman said that more suits might be filed within the next several days.
