

Kissinger Meets McCarthy For Talks at White House

WASHINGTON, March 16 (AP)—One of President Nixon's key advisers, Henry A. Kissinger, who seems to be opening up communications with doves who usually are his strongest critics, has met privately with former Senator Eugene J. McCarthy.

Mr. McCarthy's office here confirmed today that he had

lunch with Mr. Kissinger yesterday and engaged in an hour of conversation at the West Wing of the White House. Mr. McCarthy's office would give no details of the luncheon talk.

Mr. Kissinger met March 6 with Tom Davidson, William Davidson and Sister Beverly Bell, three of seven persons named as co-conspirators but not defendants in an alleged plot to kidnap Mr. Kissinger and sabotage heating systems in Federal buildings here.
