

Agnew, Leaving Spain, Calls On Juan Carlos

MADRID, July 19 — Vice President Agnew concluded his three-day official visit to Spain today with unexpectedly long courtesy calls on Prince Juan Carlos de Borbón, the designated successor to Generalissimo Francisco, and on Vice President Luis Carrero Blanco.

Mr. Agnew's visit, the 20th here by high Nixon Administration officials over the last year or so, has been highly prized by Spanish officials as giving them still more recognition and attention by the United States.

Mr. Agnew's press spokesman, Victor Gold, declined to comment today on Washington reports that the Vice President had been unaware of President's Nixon's initiative to visit Peking.

Mr. Gold did say that there had been no personal conversation between the President and the Vice President since Mr. Agnew's departure from Washington on June 27.
