FBI to Hike China Security

Washington (AP) - J. Edgar Hoove has told Congress the FBI expects to step up its efforts to combat Communist Chinese "intelligence-gathering and revolution-inspiring activities" in the United States.

The FBI director said Peking considers the United States "its chief enemy."

Hoover made the stat ment to a closed Senate hearing three weeks before President Lixon announced plans to go to the People's Republic of China as a step toward normalization of relations.

The Director's statement was rele sed ýesterday as the Senate acted on a bill that includes FBI appropriations. A spokesman said Hoover would have no comment.
