Nixon-With Meany 240

NEW YORK AP - George Meany said Sunday he has a copy of a telephone memorandum showing that the "White House gang" deliberately tried to create a hostile reception for President Nixon when he addressed the AFL-CIO convention last Nov. 19 in order to create public sympathy for him.

"Somebody leaked it?" Mike Wallace on the CBS-TV program "60 Minutes" asked of the memorandum.

"Leaked it?" Meany replied. "They delivered it."

The purported memorandum was of a conversation between George Bell, a presidential aide, and Pat Juliano, who works for the Office of Emergency Preparedness.

Meany said, appearing to paraphrase from what he said was the memo:

"Mr. Juliano called at 9:30. He is at the AFL-CIO convention in Ball Harbour, Fla. . . President Nixon is going to speak at 10:30 a.m. They will chastise him and that will be the best thing that could happen. George Meany will be trying to make himself look like a big deal, but the American people will see the spectacle and decide for themselves on the merit of what Nixon is trying to do . . .

"Mr. Juliano will give Mr. Bell a full report upon his return from the meeting. He thinks it will make President Nixon look great in the eyes of the American electorate."

"Then a footnote, Mr. Bell wants Mr. Juliano to call him after Nixon's speech and let him know how things went. Discreetly and indirectly to get the reaction of others. This is from a White House telephone memorandum."

Meany then showed Wallace the memorandum.
