Kissinger Is Called 'President'

Charlotte, N.C.

The American party presidential candidate warned yesterday of a totalitarian government if President Nixon is re-elected and called Henry Kissinger "the unelected, de facto president."

John G. Schmitz charged that Kissinger "is the true president of the United States right now" and said the presidential adviser "is from the council of foreign relations which is dedicated to a one-world socialist system."

The congressman from California told newsmen and about 50 supporters, mostly teen-agers, at an airport news conference that if Mr. Nixon were re-elected "things are going to get so bad that people will remember who told them about it."

He said Mr. Nixon would make the country "totalitarian," adding it would "become evident before elections are done away with — we will have a couple more free elections."
