Rep. Schmitz Says Nation
Has Enthroned an Emperor

ANAHEIM, Calif., Nov 8 (UPI) — Representative John G. Schmitz, American party candidate for President, gave an untypical concession speech last night, asserting that his party's future was just beginning and that voters "have now enthroned an emperor."

"Nixon put us ahead of schedule towards George Orwell's '1948,' faster in four years than anyone I've ever seen," Mr. Schmitz told about 300 supporters at the Disneyland Hotel.

He said that the party would place candidates on all 50 state ballots in the next Presidential election, compared with the 35 states this time.

As a result of this campaign, Mr. Schmitz said, he saw a whole "subnation of people who refuse to surrender given the same odds that the founding fathers had. No one's going to stop us," he continued, "we're going to build, build, build. You can't assassinate a party. You can't assassinate a principle."
