

No Plans for Cuba Ties --Kissinger

Secretary of State Henry Kissinger said yesterday that the United States has no intention of restoring diplomatic relations with Cuba.

Kissinger's remarks came as he left the Organization of American States conference where the first tentative steps were taken to renew contacts with the Communist regime of Fidel Castro.

Members agreed to consult their governments about possible future involvement of Cuba in the OAS.

The United States, which recently allowed American auto makers operating in Argentina to sell vehicles to Cuba, did not object to the consultations.

But in his 30-minute address to the OAS delegates Saturday, Kissinger made no reference to Cuba.

Before leaving yesterday for Washington, he was asked by reporters why he did not speak of Cuba.

"Because we don't have any intention of restoring diplomatic relations with Cuba and I don't expect this will be a big subject this week," Kissinger replied.
