...ent. Senators Clifford P. Case (Rep-N.J.) and Frank Church (Dem-Idaho) agreed to press forward with their amendment to block further use of U.S. Air, land and sea forces on or over Indochina. The two senators first drafted their proposal several months ago, put it aside until all U.S. prisoners and forces were withdrawn from Vietnam under the terms negotiated by the U.S. in Paris. The theory behind their amendment is now that U.S.

...combat forces are...Vietnam. U.S. participation in the Vietnam war is ended. And therefore any further use of combat forces anywhere in Indochina would constitute a new war requiring the advance consent of Congress. The two senators didn't decide on a legislative vehicle for their amendment. They will consult Senate leaders and allies on the choice of which bill to attach their amendment to. While the Case-Church

amendment applies to all types of combat throughout Indochina. Senator Walter Mondale (Dem-Minn.) said that he will press for an immediate no-bombing amendment applicable to Cambodia only.
