

## Demos Vote for End to Bombing

Washington

Senate Democrats overwhelmingly voted yesterday for an end of the U. S. bombing in Cambodia.

A resolution calling for an end to any military activity by the U.S. in Cambodia was passed by the caucus of Senate Democrats, who have a majority in the upper chamber.

Although the resolution is non-binding, it reflects the growing Senate opposition to the bombing and foreshadows likely approval later this month of legislation to actually cut off funds for

U.S. military activities in Cambodia.

The resolution was approved at the closed-door caucus by voice vote, with only three members reported in opposition.

Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield (Mont.) said in a speech to the caucus: "We must seek to foreclose further military commitment in Cambodia and bring to an end the involvement in which we are already engaged there, at a cost of hundreds of millions of dollars, and at the risk of the accumulation of new casualties and more prisoners of war."
