

Grand Jury Gets a Report On Violence at San Jose

SAN JOSE, Calif., Nov. 12 (AP)—A grand jury committee has received a voluminous police report on the violent demonstration at President Nixon's campaign visit here two weeks ago, but it will be next week before a decision is made on whether to start a full investigation.

Leonard W. Winston, chairman of the three-man criminal complaints committee of the Santa Clara County grand jury, said yesterday that the police report was a "narrative summary" compiled at the grand jury's request.

The demonstration occurred outside the Civic Auditorium, where Mr. Nixon had appeared at a campaign rally with Gov. Ronald Reagan and Senator George Murphy, Republicans of California. The White House said that the President's limousine was hit by several rocks and eggs.
