The White House put out a list of consumer advocates invited to meet with President Nixon today to discuss his economic program and plans for the period beyond the current wage-price freeze, and one question raised was why Ralph Nader was not on the list.

Ronald L. Zeigler, the White House press secretary, said invitations went out only to persons representing "official membership organizations" and denied that Mr. Nader's criticism of the President's economic policies had anything to do with it.

Mr. Nader was a guest at the White House for the wedding of Tricia Nixon and a former "Nader's Raider," Edward Finch Cox. Of today's meeting the consumer advocate observed: "I was invited to Tricia's wedding, but I guess this is too trivial."
