**Nixon Follows Rams
Game--Until 4 a.m.**

WASHINGTON — Midway through his talks in the Azores, with French President Georges Pompidou, President Nixon stayed up until 4:30 a.m. to listen to the Los Angeles Rams-Washington Redskins football game on the radio.

Twice he called Secretary of State William Rogers to exult over Redskins touchdowns, and when the game was over he awoke his assistant, H. R. Haldeman, to tell him the Redskins had won.

The President's grim appearance at the end of the talks, and the slurring of words that sometimes marks his speech when he is especially fatigued were attributed by White House aides to

the fact that the football game had kept him up.
