—Mrs. Richard M. Nixon joined royal Ghanaian women in a traditional tribal dance today, executing a mincing little promenade at a lush hilltop festival held in her honor by Ghanaian chieftains. The tribal leaders told Mrs. Nixon that her visit cemented a friendship with Chief Nana Osae Djan II that "not even a lion could break."

The First Lady expressed hope that accounts of her welcome would draw tourists from around the world to this West African country.

She drove the 22 miles from Accra to Aburi to renew ties with the 83-year-old blind chief, whom she and her husband met on a trip in 1957, when he was Vice President.

On her last day of a twoday stay in Accra, Mrs. Nixon also had a five-minute private talk with President Edward Akufo-Addo, who is 65 years old and has been ailing.

She lunched with President Akufo-Addo's wife at his mountainview residential compound.
