Nixon, on Guam, Asks Prayer for 'New Day'

AGANA, Guam, Monday, Feb. 21—President Nixon left Guam at 7:10 A.M. today on the final leg of his flight to

Peking.

Nixon said brief good-bys to local officials at Guam International Airport and then the

national Airport and then the President, grinning broadly, turned for a last wave at the crowd in this American island territory.

About 5,000 people at the airport and 8,000 in the center of this small capital city greeted the President when he arrived at 5:15 Sunday afternoon (2:15 A.M. Sunday, New York time) from Hawaii. In addressing the crowd at the airport, Mr. Nixon recalled the saying that Guam is where the American day begins.

"I would hope that all of you here today would join me in this prayer," the President said, "that with this trip to China a new day may begin for the whole world."
