In his response to a speech by Premier Chou En-lai, President Nixon used a phrase very similar to one in President Lincoln's Get-

tysburg Address.

Noting extensive news coverage of the welcome banquet, Mr. Nixon said that although the historic occasion was probably seen and listened to by more persons than any previous such

event, "What we say here will not be long remembered. What we do here can change the world."

Lincoln, in his Nov. 19, 1863, address dedicating a portion of the Gettysburg battlefield as a cemetery to the soldiers who died there. the soldiers who died there. said: "The world will little note nor long remember what we say here.
