Tricky Dick Nixon, "used-car salesman" extraordinaire, has been magically transformed by four years in the White House.

According to a poll done for Newsweek by the Gallup Organization, nearly half of all voters think that Richard Nixon is "very close" or "fairly close" to their idea of what a President should be. In addition, it is McGovern who comes across as "a politician," and Nixon as a "wise, warm, sincere, principled, even a fun-loving leader of men."
