Mrs. Nixon Bids Critic Of War Read History

PHILADELPHIA, Oct. 26
(AP) — Mrs. Richard Nixon had a brief encounter with an antiwar protester and suggested that he study history a little more.

Mrs. Nixon came here yesterday for a luncheon sponsored by a philanthropic organization that runs a recreation project for poor children.

She had landed by helicopter and was being greeted by a crowd of well-wishers. A man who later identified himself as Bob Dicifson, 56 years old an architect, shook her hand said, "I am a Quaker, and if your husband calls himself a Quaker I want to know why he has dropped more bombs than any other man in history."

"You had just better read your history," Mrs. Nixon replied. Then she moved on to greet others in the crowd.
