

JULIE EISENHOWER TO BE TV HOSTESS

Will Substitute for Week
on 'Not for Women Only'

Julie Nixon Eisenhower, the younger daughter of former President Richard M. Nixon, will substitute for Barbara Walters as moderator of the syndicated television series "Not for Women Only" during one of the three weeks Miss Walters will be absent.

Miss Walters, who is also co-host of the "Today" program on NBC-TV, has left for Egypt to interview President Anwar el-Sadat and his wife for the early morning network program.

Mrs. Eisenhower will begin videotaping her five half-hour programs here on Tuesday, at WNBC-TV, although they will not be shown until late October because Miss Walters has pretaped a backlog of programs. "Not for Women Only" is carried by television stations in 80 other cities after the segments are broadcast on WNBC-TV, the originating station.

The topic for Mrs. Eisenhower's week of programs is indicated by the subtitle, "Public People, Private Lives."

A panel of guests, who may participate in all or a few of the programs, will include Representative Barry Goldwater Jr., Republican of California; Nick Timmesch, syndicated columnist for The Los Angeles Times; Mrs. Norman Vincent Peale, wife of the minister and author; Dollie Cole, senior editor of The Saturday Evening Post who is also wife of the president of General Motors; Edward N. Cole; Roberta Peters, the opera star, and Tish Baldrige, former social secretary to Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, while she was in the White House.

Also participating will be Dr. Daniel Casriel, director of the Casriel Institute of Group Dynamics, who in his private practice attends a number of famous persons and their children.

Following Mrs. Eisenhower's week as moderator, Polly Bergen, the singer, will be host of a week of programs on the subject of children, and Jerry Lewis will moderate the third week's discussion on the new comedians.
