Eisenhower College in Seneca Falls, N. Y., is looking for a new president to succeed John Rosenkrans, and its search committee of trustees included Gen. Lauris Norstad, chairman of the board; Gen. Alfred M. Gruenther, Gen. Andrew J. Goodpaster and David Eisenhower. Mr. Rosenkrans, a local insurance broker who was chairman of the founding committee, became president before the liberal arts college opened in 1968.

Designated as the official memorial to the late President, the college was granted \$9-million by Congress in December. Although its enrollment is down to 600 from a peak of 779, "it is now possible to talk about the college's future," according to Joseph D. Coffee Jr., executive vice president, who will be come acting president July 1.
