

Julie Eisenhower: Looking for Work

Julie Nixon Eisenhower plans to resign as Washington editor of The Saturday Evening Post on July 15, informed sources said Saturday.

Mrs. Eisenhower, who celebrates her 26th birthday July 5, "wants to do something else now," sources said. "She does not find the job challenging enough," they said. "She is a pretty challenging girl."

Richard M. Nixon's daughter took on the \$15,000-a-year job about three years ago, while her father was President, and later became a member of the editorial board of the magazine. She also has been working on children's books.

Mrs. Eisenhower is presently in San Clemente, Calif., with her patents and

is expected to return to Washington in a week or so.

After Nixon resigned the presidency last August, Mrs. Eisenhower, who was her father's most outspoken defender, was offered several television spots. One attractive offer came from the American Broadcasting Company, sources said, but her husband, David Eisenhower, opposed her becoming a television personality, sources said.

Nixon, however, was all for his daughters going into big-time television and urged her to take the position, the sources reported. She had a week-long guest interviewer spot on Barbara Walter's Show and critics gave her high marks for her poise.
