New York, April 2 (AP)- Mrs. Marguerite C. Oswald has announced that she dismissed New York lawyer Mark Lane, who sought before the Warren commission to clear her late son, Lee Harvey Oswald, of the killing of President Kennedy.

Mrs. Oswald told a newsman yesterday at her New York Hotel (Beekman Tower) that she wrote to Lane on Tuesday dispensing with his services.

She said Lane had done a fine investigating job but "his services are no longer required because I am able to conduct my own investigation. "

Mrs. Oswald's letter to Lane also asked him to send her a copy of his report to the commission and to stop any "organized campaign" on behalf of her son through his "citizens committee of inquiry."

She explained that she had received no contributions from an appeal she made in Chicago March 21 for money to pay for an office, investigator and stenographer - and she felt this was because people mistakenly believed she was affiliated with that committee.

Lane, replying the same day he received Mrs. Oswald's letter, agreed to termination of the attorney-client relationship and promised a copy of his report. He also expressed confidence that "in due course, all of the facts will be presented to the American people despite the fact that your son was denied the right to a trial."

Lane agreed last Jan. 11 to represent Mrs. Oswald free of charge in collecting information on the successive shootings in Dallas of the President on Nov. 22 and her son on Nov. 24 and present it to the commission.
