

**ELLSBERG DEFENSE
COMBATS SUBPOENA**

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 8 (AP) — The defense for Dr. Daniel Ellsberg has filed a motion to block a Federal grand jury subpoena for record stored under Dr. Ellsberg's name.

Assistant United States Attorney David Nissen said yesterday the subpoena had come from a different grand jury investigation from that in which Dr. Ellsberg was indicted for unauthorized possession of the secret pentagon papers dealing with United States involvement in Vietnam.

Dr. Ellsberg's attorney, Arthur Berman, made the motion in United States District Court here to stop the subpoena for records stored at the Bekins Van Storage Company.

Mr. Berman said an official of the Southern California com-

pany had appeared before the grand jury yesterday for about 15 minutes.

But Mr. Nissen said the Federal panel was waiting for a ruling by Judge Matt Byrne before it would move to obtain the stored records. Dr. Ellsberg is awaiting trial for possession of the secret papers and his next scheduled court appearance is on Jan. 4.
