

# Sakharov, Ellsberg Honored

Daniel Ellsberg and Soviet dissident Andrei D. Sakharov were jointly honored with a peace award yesterday and both called for a true detente based on individual liberties.

The absent Sakharov said in a tape - recorded and translated message to the pro - disarmament organization SANE that he considered it "a significant coincidence" to be jointly honored with Ellsberg, who made the so-called Pentagon papers public.

Sakharov said if basic rights of emigration, national self-determination and freedom of conviction and conscience are abrogated "then this is fraught with danger not only within one country but for all mankind.

Ellsberg, accepting SANE's Eleanor Roosevelt Peace Award in person, said it was important to negotiate peace with the Soviet Union, but "detente cannot be made at the cost of collaborating with leaders in either country who plan to keep making jails of those countries."
