White Panthers Call Charge Of Kidnap Plot 'Fabrication'

ANN ARBOR, Mich., March 17
(AP)—Leaders of the White Panther party denied today charges that the group considered kidnapping Vice President Agnew and others to gain release of jailed radicals, terming them a "total fabrication."

In a formal statement released from their headquarters here, the party leaders said that the government had concocted false charges to keep two cofounders of the party, John A. Sinclair and Lawrence R. Plamondon, in jail.

The two have been indicted by a Federal grand jury for allegedly conspiring to bomb a Central Intelligence Agency office in Ann Arbor in September, 1968.

Sinclair, chairman of the, party, is serving a 9½-to-10-year sentence in Michigan for possession of marijuana.
