

Federal Trial for Leslie in Bomb Plot

Leslie Bacon, 20, daughter of a wealthy Atherton lumber merchant, was ordered today to stand trial in a New York federal court May 15 on a charge of conspiring to fire-bomb a Manhattan bank.

Miss Bacon, who has been free on \$10,000 bail, was not in court in New York when the trial date was set by U.S. District Judge Sylvester J. Ryan.

She was jailed for contempt in Seattle last spring for refusing to testify before a federal grand jury investigating the bombing of the Capitol in Washington.

However, the United States Court of Appeals here later ruled the jailing had been illegal and ordered her release.

Miss Bacon is charged with plotting with a half dozen other persons to place an in-

cidental bomb in the branch of the First National City Bank in Manhattan's upper east side.

The alleged plot was never carried out.
