U.S. JURY INDICTS **BOMB PLOT FIGURE**

Leslie Bacon Is Accused of Lying About Capitol Visit

SEATTLE, March 29 (AP) A Federal grand jury has indicted Leslie Bacon, the anti-war activist, on a charge of lying to a grand jury last year when she denied being inside the United States Capitol hours before a bomb cycledd in before a bomb exploded in a men's room.

A secret indictment, issued here last Friday, was made public today by United States Attorney Stan Pitkin when a summons for Miss Bacon, then 19 years old, was arrested by Federal Bureau of Investigation agents in Washington as a material witness to the March 1, 1971, explosion in the Senate wing of the Capitol. She was taken into custody on April 27, and a Federal judge ordered her transfered to Seattle for a grand jury investigation.

She was held in lieu of \$100,000 bail for several days. For three days she testified before the grand jury; then she refused to answer questions about a New York City bomb plot and was ordered to testify about that incident later.

During her testimony here, Miss Bacon publicly denied several times that she knew anything about a Capitol bombing plot.
