**Student Is
 Jailed in
 U.S. Probe**

A 30-year-old student from Oregon was jailed for contempt of court here yesterday after he refused to answer questions before a federal grand jury investigating the radical Weatherman organization.

Mark Alter, a resident of Sandy, Ore., and a student at nearby Mount Hood Community College, faces jail for some 14 months—the remaining life of the grand jury — or until he answers the questions.

U.S. District Judge Spencer Williams rejected a dozen grounds Alter and his attorneys presented for not testifying — including alleged illegal wiretapping — saying he had “no valid legal reason not to answer” and then ordered the bearded and ponytailed student to jail.

Alter, who is a graduate of the University of Louisville, was asked — and refused to answer — three questions:

Did he acquire an automobile registration card in Illinois in February of 1970?

Did he ever visit 1038-A Pine street in San Francisco? (An apartment house allegedly frequented by Weathermen.)

Did he have “any notion” as to why an identification card with his name on it “might have been located” at 1038-A Pine street?
