Lawyers Plan

To Be in Court

Attorney John Thorne said yesterday that he and two other lawyers representing George Jackson and the Soledad Brothers" will be in court today as planned, despite Jackson's death in an escape attempt at San Quentin Saturday.

The lawyers are scheduled to appear at a hearing on their challenge to Superior Court Judge Frank Shaw's qualifications to preside over the murder trial of the "Soledad Brothers." It was not expected, however, that the two remaining inmates, Fleeta Drumgo and John Clutchette, would appear in court.

Thorne said the three attorneys were in Carmel planning details of their defense case Saturday when the escape try was made.
