

Father Seeks Probe

PASADENA — (AP) — The father of slain Soledad Brother George Jackson said today he's started a nationwide effort to enlist support from black Americans for a probe into his son's death.

"We want to investigate the conflicting stories coming out of San Quentin," Lester Jackson Jr., 50, said in an interview from his home here.

Prison officials said Jackson, 29, was shot and killed by a guard Saturday during an escape attempt in which

three guards and two inmates also died.

"We've started a signature campaign for an investigation because Governor Reagan won't do anything," the elder Jackson said. "We're trying to get black voters in the state and around the United States to send their names and addresses to my home."

Jackson, a postal worker, complained that he has been given no help in his campaign from black organizations.

"They're afraid," he said.
