

Angela Loses Bid

For Trial Delay

Angela Davis lost today her motion for continuance of her kidnap-murder case to allow her attorney more time to interview more of the 103 witnesses and study the more than 400 photographs of the prosecution.

"All further motions by the defendant are to be filed by Sept. 20." Superior Judge Richard Arnason said after rejecting the continuance motion of defense attorney Howard Moore Jr.

Assistant Attorney General Albert W. Harris had called "shocking" the series of delays which has kept the case in court for eight months without trial.

Judge Arnason said if the defense goes through with its announced plan to seek a change of venue that will be the last motion to be argued.

Ernest Graves, attorney for Ruchell Magee, who is charged with Miss Davis in the Aug. 7, 1970 Marin Civic Center shooting, was a courtroom spectator. he said Magee's motion for exhumation of the body of slain Judge Harold Haley will be argued Sept. 22.

Magree claims exhumation will show that Judge Haley's fatal wound was not fired from inside the van commandeered by the kidnapers.
