

Mother Fails to Get Effects of George Jackson

Georgia Jackson, mother of George Jackson, slain in the escape attempt at San Quentin in August, was tentatively denied a request yesterday that the state be forced to turn over his effects to her.

Superior Court Judge Samuel W. Gardiner of Marin filed a tentative order saying the state had the right to hold the property if it appears that it may be needed as possible evidence in the case.

Before making the order final, he gave Mrs. Jackson's attorney, Edward Bell, until tomorrow to file additional material to support the mother's plea.
