

## Court Authorizes Magee Trial Delay

Ruchell Magee, the San Quentin inmate implicated in the 1970 Marin county Civic Center shooting, yesterday was granted further postponement of his trial.

The court agreed to delay the start of Magee's trial on murder, kidnap and conspiracy charges for six months or until completion of the Angela Davis trial in San Jose, whichever comes first.

The delay was sought to allow Magee the opportunity to prove that the 1965 robbery conviction in Los Angeles that sent him to San Quentin was faulty and should be set aside.

Miss Davis, a former UCLA philosophy professor, is scheduled to go on trial January 31 on the same charges, also stemming from the Civic Center episode in which Judge Harold Haley and three other persons died.

While granting the defense motion for postponement of Magee's trial, Superior Court Judge Leonard Ginsburg allowed two members of the prisoner's defense committee to serve as court-appointed legal assistants. They are Almira Peoples and Geraldine Johnson, both of San Francisco.
