Q Warden Accused

San Quentin warden Louis Nelson was accused today of trying to set up another round of killing at the prison by his "repressive" treatment of the men in the top security adjustment center.

Mrs. Inez Williams, mother of Fleeta Drumgo, who is on trial here with John Clutchette accused of killing a guard at Soledad prison two years ago, made the accusation at a press conference called to protest conditions at the prison.

One of Six

Her son is also one of six men accused of murder and conspiracy for the Aug. 21, 1971, death of three guards and two inmates at San Quentin and she accused the warden today of "setting up another August 21."

She said the treatment the 22 men on the first tier of the adjustment center were re-

ceiving was repressive and in addition they were being labelled as dangerous by prison authorities.

Mrs. Williams, who said

she spoke for the other mothers of the men in the center, complained that their sons did not receive hot meals, were locked in their cells 24 hours a day, received no exercise time, and were only allowed one half-hour visit a day.

Letters Cited

She also said letters from their sons took up to two weeks to reach them and sometimes their sons never received the letters written to them.

The six inmates were scheduled to enter pleas today in Marin Superior Court, but the case was delayed when they filed a motion accusing Judge Warren E. McGuire of being prejudiced.

McGuire recessed the hearing to determine whether the challenge was sufficient to halt the proceedings.
