

Attorneys Meet**Carr Case Ban  
In Angela Trial**

SAN JOSE — Attorneys in the Angela Davis case conferred in chambers with Judge Richard Arnason today, discussing among other things the savage slaying last week of black militant James Carr.

After the morning-long conference, the judge met with the attorneys for 35 minutes this afternoon and then asked members of the Santa Clara Superior Court jury if they were aware of the slaying.

Eight jurors said they were, but none said in answer to the judge's questions that what they had seen or heard would influence their judgment in the case.

Arnason instructed the

jurors to continue refraining from reading or listening to anything connected with the murder, kidnaping and conspiracy case.

**'No Relationship'**

He also instructed them to avoid reading anything about the Carr slaying. Carr was a friend of George Jackson whose freedom was supposed to be the goal of the Marin escape try Miss Davis is accused of aiding.

Arnason said that there was no evidence of any relationship between Carr and Miss Davis and no evidence connecting his death to the Davis case.
