## Angela at Hearing For Magee

Angela Davis visited a Marin courtroom yesterday and heard a trial date of May 22 set for her former co-defendant, Ruchell Magee, on charges of murder, kidnap, conspiracy and assault.

Accusations against both Miss Davis and Magee, a 33-year-old San Quentin inmate, arise from the same event — the Aug. 7, 1970, escape attempt and shootout at the Marin Civic Center in which four persons were killed, among them Superior Court Judge Harold Haley.

Magee is accused of firing the shot that killed Judge Haley. Miss Davis is on trial in San Jose, charged with having engineered the escape plot and providing the weapons used in the shooting.

The trials of Miss Davis and Magee were separated last July and at that time Magee said he would not

proceed until the Angela Davis trial was concluded.

After winning the right to defend himself, Magee last Friday petitioned for a speedy trial and further asked that he be transferred from San Quentin's Adjustment Center to the Marin County Jail so he might better prepare his defense.

At yesterday's hearing before Tulare County Superior Court Judge Leonard M. Ginsberg, Magee's request for a transfer to Marin County Jail was taken under advisement.

If Magee was aware that Miss Davis and a small entourage were in the courtroom behind him, he gave no indication of it. And she did not approach him after the hearing.

Miss Davis spent 90 minutes in the courtroom, which is next to the judicial chamber where Judge Haley was presiding Aug. 7, 1970 when he and four others were taken hostage by Magee and two other San Quentin convicts and 17-year-old Jonathan Jackson.

It is also next to the courtroom in which six San Quentin convicts charged in the slaying of three prison guards and three inmates last August 21 were appearing yesterday for pre-trial hearings.
