SAN JOSE, Calif., May 8-The seventh week of testimony in the trial of Angela Davis began today with a former San Quentin convict testifying that the defendant visited the prison with Jonathan Jackson the day before an escape attempt by three convicts aided by the Jackson youth at the Marin County Courthouse.

The witness, Louis F. May, said that Miss Davis did not enter the prison but that she came to the gate with a man that he said he recognized as Jonathan Jackson.

May, who is now on parole. said that Jackson had entered the prison alone. He said he had seen him leaving and then later drive away in a yellow

He testified that Miss Davis was with Jackson in the front seat and that the two were talking "quite loud." He said it appeared that they were having an argument.
