

Angela Trial Bill: \$1,266,000

SAN JOSE — Total local court and security costs for the Angela Davis trial today stand at \$1,226,000 following submission of the final Santa Clara County bill in the amount of \$198,936.

Acting Presiding Superior Judge Homer B. Thompson signed the final bill yesterday, bringing this county's four - month portion of the 19 - month court proceeding to \$684,900.

Marin County has billed the state for \$581,000 as its portion of the case that was transferred here on a change of venue.

While Marin County has been informed it will obtain state repayment for only \$183,000 of its share, Santa Clara County expects to obtain some \$500,000, according to Phil Batchelor of the county executive's office, who said final conferences on repayment will be held next month.

The higher percentage repayment expected here was attributed to a difference in bookkeeping systems between the two counties.

A separate account was kept of all expenditures made here, while Marin County mingled expenses for

the controversial case with other court and law enforcement expenditures.

The final Santa Clara terday included \$102,878 for security force salaries, \$44,065 for services that included remodeling and \$92 for medical services to Miss Davis, \$39,422 for fixed assets including a metal detector still in use here and \$13,571 for administrative overhead.

Miss Davis was found not guilty of murder, kidnapping and conspiracy in the Aug. 7, 1970, Marin County Civic Center shootout in which four died.
