

Carr Defendants Continue Appeal

Two men charged with the slaying of a San Jose ex-convict during the Angela Davis trial have appealed to the State Supreme Court for a hearing on a motion for a change of venue.

Their request to the State Court of Appeal was denied without comment.

The accused murderers are Richard Rodriguez, 22, of Baldwin Park and Lammarr Lloyd Mims of Los Angeles, who claim they cannot get a fair trial in Santa

Clara County because of prejudicial publicity.

The victim, James R. Carr, 26, was gunned down at the San Jose home of his mother-in-law, Joan Hammer, who was active in the movement to free George Jackson, subsequently killed in an aborted San Quentin escape attempt.

Rodriguez and Mims are charged with murder, conspiracy to commit murder and possession of a firebomb.
