Magee Trial Postponed To Nov. 27

The trial of black convict Ruchell Magee has been delayed again until Nov. 27.

Robert Carrow, co-counsel for Magee, asked that the trial be delayed until Jan. 10 because he has another trial scheduled in Sonoma County Oct. 18 when Magee's trial was to begin.

Carrow said he is suffering from ulcers and wanted more time to acquaint his new co-counsel, Rommel Bondoc, with the case.

Superior Court Judge Morton Colvin refused to postpone the case until Jan. 10 but granted a delay until Nov. 27.

Magee is accused of firing the shot that killed Superior Court Judge Harold J. Haley during an Aug. 7, 1970, gun battle at the Marin County Courthouse in San Rafael in which three others also died.

Angela Davis was tried separately and acquitted in the case.
