Almost simultaneously with the announcement of the indictments, the Federal Bureau of Investigation announced the arrest in New York City of one of those indicted, a 27-year-old lawyer.

Other Charges Made

All 28 were charged, in one count of the indictment, with conspiring to burglarize a Government building, to steal public records, to remove and mutilate public records and to interfere with the administration of the Selective Service Act.

In addition, the six other counts of the indictment charged 21 of the group with breaking into and entering the United States Post Office Building in Camden—which also Houses the Federal District Court and the grand jury room—with unlawfully removing public records, committing depredations against public records, stealing public records and interfering with the Selective Service Act.

Three of the persons indicted were in court, having been subpoenaed to testify before the grand jury, and were arrested immediately. Other scheduled witnesses were excused until Sept. 22, when a new grand jury will resume the investigation.
