FILES STOLEN, SAY JEWISH ACTIVISTS

A rabbi who heads the Jewish Activist Movement, a newly formed group, said Tuesday that the files and correspondence at the group's headquarters in Brooklyn had been stolen. He added that he believed the burglary might have been the work of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

A spokesman at the New York office of the F.B.I. vigorously denied the allegation.

Rabbi Eliyahu Birnbaum, chairman of the movement, said all correspondence, membership and donation files were missing when he arrived at its office yesterday morning. The office is on the second floor of a building at 661 Atlantic Avenue.

He said that \$15 in an envelope on a typewriter was not disturbed. He said that whoever "raided" the office had smeared slogans on the wall in an attempt to make people think the raid was staged by another Jewish group.

Rabbi Birnbaum said his group had been formed about a month ago and included members of the former Student Activists for Soviet Jewry,

Activists for Soviet Jewry, whose office his group now occupies. He said that an F.B.I. agent had visited the office about two months ago seeking the names of donors, members and correspondence. members and correspondence files.
