Two Directors Asked for FBI

WASHINGTON — (UPI) — Rep. Cornelius E. Gallagher (D-N.J.) under federal indictment for perjury and tax evasion, today introduced legislation that would create a dual directorship for the FBI.

One job would be for criminal investigations, the second for national security, with both posts limited to five years' duration.

Gallagher's legislation would also create a review board to eliminate unnecessary material from the FBI's files. The panel would operate for 18 months and then be abolished.
